This amendment hereby answers the questions from the site visit:

- Is the clear coat requirement intended to provide additional UV/weather protection, or is it primarily intended to achieve the specified gloss level?

Both, the clear coat is a requirement for UV protection, ease of cleaning, and to achieve a gloss finish.

- Would the Government consider an exterior-rated, two-component polyurethane color coat that provides the required color, gloss, UV resistance, and weather durability without a separate clear coat?

Yes, if approved by the Contracting Officer. All paint system must follow manufacturer's recommendations for mixing and application.

- If so, would the Government allow the contractor to submit an equivalent primer and single-stage polyurethane coating system for approval in lieu of the specified primer/color/clear-coat system?

Yes, the contractor can propose an equivalent product. According to contract specifications the contractor needs to submit the intended product for use for approval by the Contracting Officer before a system can be applied.

- Does the 150-day period begin at contract award and require the project to be completed within those 150 days, or does the 150 days represent the period within which the project must be started?

The contract period starts when the contractor receives notice to proceed. This period is to full contract completion, which would include prework submittals, contract work, and closeout submittals.

- If the 150-day period is intended for completion, how will weather-related delays be handled? Given the location of the artifacts in central/northern Pennsylvania, the project would extend into the winter months, when weather conditions may significantly limit or prevent exterior work. Would weather-related delays result in an extension of the period of performance?

The intended contract period is **400** days which would run through a portion of next summer (2027) hopefully mitigating any winter weather impacts. The contracting project letter sent in the original package from the customer to contracting reflects this longer period. However,

the PWS was not updated, and the change was missed in our groups back checking process.
The PWS would be updated with award.

All other terms and conditions remain the same.
