Proposal Preparation Instructions:

The proposal shall be clear, concise, and include sufficient detail for effective evaluation and for substantiating the validity of stated claims. The proposal should not simply rephrase or restate the Government's requirements but, rather, shall provide convincing rationale to address how the Offeror intends to meet these requirements. Offerors shall assume that the Government has no prior knowledge of their facilities or experience and will base its evaluation on the information presented in the Offeror's proposal. To ensure timely and equitable evaluation of proposals, Offerors must follow the instructions contained herein. Proposals must be complete, self-sufficient, and respond directly to the requirement of this solicitation.

Proposals shall be sent to 2nd Lt Robert Albrightson (robert.albrightson@us.af.mil) and SrA Jesse Wisowaty (jesse.wisowaty@us.af.mil).

1. Complete blocks 14 through 20C of the RFQ Section A, SF1442. In doing so, the Offeror accepts the contract terms and conditions as written in RFQ Sections A through K. Signature by the Offeror constitutes an offer, which the Government may accept. The "original" copy should be clearly marked under a separate cover. Complete pricing information in Section B of the solicitation.

2. Complete the Pricing Schedule utilizing the individual Statement of Work, technical factors, and Drawings. The total price proposed on the Pricing Schedule is the price that shall be honored by the Offeror who is awarded the resultant contract

3. Complete the necessary fill-ins and certifications in Sections I through K. Section K shall be returned in its entirety. For Section F through I, the Offeror shall submit only those pages that require a fill-in.
4. Other than Certified Cost or Pricing Data may be requested by the Government, if necessary.
5. No price information should be included in the technical proposal.

Proposal response shall consist of the following:

Cover page on company letterhead (1 page)

Section I - Technical, to include: Draft Progress Schedule based on a 18 September work start date, completed RFP, proof of capability bonds.

Section II - Pricing Breakdown: Pricing Breakdown must be filled out on the attached Pricing Schedule document. In order to be determined Technically acceptable, the Vendor must clearly identify major milestones for the requirement. Restating or copying the statement of work will not meet this objective. Additionally, the vendor must meet all requirements outlined in the Statement of Work. Failure to meet any of the requirements outlined will result in a determination of technical unacceptability.

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
